The broken water main and sink hole on West Richmond Avenue is a reminder of the fragility of our infrastructure--especially as it ages. The two events may not be related, but there was a 3.3 earthquake in Berkeley the morning of the water break. Its also possible that the 69 year old cast iron pipe was just tired and due. Seeing one of our beloved wigwags in a sink hole was a sorry sight.

After the arrival of the automobile, wig-wags were installed across the country to warn motorists and pedestrians of oncoming trains. The West Richmond Avenue crossing is special because it was the last automobile crossing before the transcontinental railroad terminated at Ferry Point. While in operation, our wig-wags maintained a perfect safety record, with no major accidents or recorded injuries.

Some wig-wags operated with the flag below the axis (lower quadrant type) and some with the flag above the axis (upper quadrant type). Our two wig-wags are believed to be the last remaining examples of paired upper quadrant wig-wags in the country. I hope they remain a pair. As you know, BNSF wanted to remove them, and they were only saved after a concerted effort by the community.

The wig-wag in the hole was the older of the two. It was built in Los Angeles sometime after 1914 by the Magnetic Signal Company. I understand that BNSF has removed it to their yard for safe-keeping.

Victory Morales, the chair of our Wig-Wag Restoration Committee, has been trying to sort out the legal issues to make the wig-wigs operate on special occasions. Identifying the agencies and companies with jurisdiction has not been easy. If there is any benefit to the catastrophe, it will be that the responsible parties are likely to surface. I imagine that EBMUD, the City, BNSF, and PG&E are all likely to get involved.

Dean O'Hair, from the Richmond Chevron refinery, spoke at the last meeting of the Richmond Neighborhood Coordinating Council about the proposed upgrade of the refinery and the planned new hydrogen plant. At this meeting, he, or another representative from the refinery, will give us an overview of the project and its possible effect on our community.

With summer in full swing, Keller Beach has been active. As some of you may know, a recent study rating Northern California beaches for pollution gave the beach a "D". This has been a concern. We have invited Matt Graul, East Bay Regional Parks Water Manager, to speak at our next meeting and give us an explanation of the problem.

Our Veolia-managed waste treatment plant was recently in the news because of another stench event. The City is either in the process of installing, or already has installed, monitors. What they mean for us, and how effective they will be in helping reduce the problem, is unknown. Maureen Decombe will give us a report on progress at the plant.

This promises to be an interesting meeting. I hope to see you there.

#### 1. The meeting was called to order at 7:30 pm.

Minutes of 5/25/11 were approved.

#### 2. President's Report

- Wig-wag—Victor Morales and City Attorney's office sent letter to BSNF for approval and guidelines to get wig-wags operational. The goal is to complete the project by Fall.
- The Richmond Historical Museum on Nevin Ave. requests volunteers to help maintain the museum landscape.

#### 3. Police Report: Officers Dave Longacre /Todd Opdyke

- Ten residential daytime burglaries between 5/10 and 6/14. Forced entries, kicking in doors. Possible perpetrators observed—3 black males in early 20's driving a late model small silver car (Toyota Corolla, Honda Civic?).
