Point Richmond Neighborhood Council General Meeting Minutes October 26, 2011

- 1. The meeting was called to order at 7:30 pm.
- 2. Minutes of meeting of September 28, 2011 were approved.

3. President's Report Megan Bleckinger, 1st VP (832-493-1416)

- Michelle Milam was unable to attend tonight's meeting and will give her presentation on Neighborhood Watch Groups at the November General Membership Meeting.
- November PRNC General Membership meeting will be Wednesday November 30.
- Maureen Decombe will distribute magnets with phone number to report odors from Waste Management Plant.
- A new resident will be moving into Point Richmond--Megan is pregnant!

4. Police Report/Discussion- Officers Longacre and Opdyke-

- Bank-owned apartment building at 153-157 Santa Fe now unoccupied and boarded up.
- Members of PRNC who have a chocolate importing business at 200 Garrard reported that at 3pm last Sunday a large number of cars came into their parking lot. They were racing, swerving around, etc. The members were concerned that the cars would go through the business window. The police did respond. Cars cleared out at about 4 pm.
- Question—who put up very large "No Loitering" and "Drug Free" signs on Community Center and Library? There was concern that the signs are out of character with community. City has been asked to take them down and replace them with something less intrusive.

9. Report from Land Use/Design Review Committee

Project: 44 Montana Street; Driveway repair with landscaping. Solid driveway (first 20 feet), rest of driveway permeable material to assure proper drainage. - **10. Solar and Energy Efficiency Rebate Program** Alex Thibadeau from Solar Richmond gave presentation on City of Richmond's Solar & Energy Efficiency Rebate Program which includes:
 - Rebates offered for energy upgrade projects.
 - Rebates for home solar installation (free for qualifying low income homeowners).

Additional state refunds and federal tax credits can be applied. Low interest financing available through state. Rebate is available on a first-come first-served basis, with typical installations generating \$3,000-\$7,000 rebate depending on the system size. Employment of Richmond residents to install solar systems is a condition of the program. For more information and for applications, homeowners should visit www.richmondenvironment.org or call 510-620-5537.

11. Community Air Monitoring, Chevron Heather Kulp, Walt Gill, Public Affairs, and Bob Chamberlain (air quality expert at the refinery) described Chevron's air monitoring program. They are deciding where to put a monitor in the Point Richmond area. The lead location for the new monitor is the roof of the Community Center -- with the large part of the unit housed inside the center itself in the storage closet. Members were interested in how monitoring results will be used.

12. Public Forum

- Altha Humphrey: Community Center roof leaks. Requests that the board send a letter to Keith Jabari requesting that the roof be replaced at the same time as the scheduled replacement of the roof on the fire station.
- Pat Pearson concerned about very large signs that have been placed on the Community Center which are out of character with building. Was assured that the city is aware and is planning to replace the signs with more appropriate ones.
- Bruce Kaplan: 300-400 people attended each Point Richmond Musical Festival concert. For the
 winter months there will be an Acoustic Music Series the second Friday of each month at 8 pm at
 First Methodist Church. Tickets \$15 (Peter Rowen \$20). Schedule and specific concerts will be
 announced on www.pointrichmond.com. The Festival committee is discussing adopting and
 subsidizing.
