Change in Newsletters

The City of Richmond has historically paid for printing and mailing of all the neighborhood council's newsletters. However, this year, as a result of financial pressures, the City has placed a budget-conscious limitation on the frequency of newsletters they will print and mail at four issues per year (as opposed to, in our case, 12). The PRNC Board discussed the ramifications of this decision and brainstormed a few stop-gap scenarios. Likely the solution for this year may be a combination of the following ideas, which we will continue to discuss:

- The PRNC will pay for the annual remaining eight issues of *On Point* -- printing and delivery will be paid out of the General fund
- Increase dues of those members who receive paper copies unless the member requests a waiver
- Just mail those newsletters that the city has agreed to produce annually (four).
- Send newsletters to members in good standing only
- Encourage members to switch to electronic distribution
- Provide hard copies at local businesses and Community Center

Farmer's Market

The Point Richmond Farmer's Market will kick off May 2nd. The PRNC will host a booth on May 30th. In cooperation with the Farmer's Market organizers, the PRNC will host a booth once per month for the duration of the Market season, and we are looking for volunteers to help staff the booth. In memory of Peter Minkwitz, donations are being accepted to fund the bay side Ferry Point Tunnel Mural. General Meeting Minutes

February 29, 2012

- 1. The meeting was called to order at 7:32 pm.
- 2. Minutes of January 25, 2012 meeting were approved with the addition of the non-emergency number for police assistance (510-233-1214)
- **3. President's Report** (Megan Bleckinger, President) Megan announced the sad news that PRNC President Peter Minkwitz passed away February 11, 2012. She described him as a kindhearted man, one who welcomed others with open arms, and a great mentor. Bruce Beyaert thanked Megan for stepping up and taking Peter's place while he was sick. Bruce described Peter's equanimity in dealing with the issues that arose as Peter and Doreen were building their "dream house" on Bishop Alley.

Bruce announced that in lieu of flowers the family is asking those who would like to honor Peter to give donations in Peter's name to Point Richmond Neighborhood Council to be used to complete the Keller Beach tunnel mural. Estimated cost is \$7,500. Chevron donated has \$1,000 to that fund in Peter's memory.

A nominating committee has been appointed to identify candidates for president and secretary. The following individuals are on the nominating committee-- Nate Trevor, Art Mowry, Megan Bleckinger, Bruce Bayert, Sue Rosenof.

- **4. Police Report (Stephen Andretich-sandretich@richmondpd.net) (Non-emergency number for police assistance--510-233-1214.** Officer Andretich will be driving Car #10 or #1. Crime stats for Point Richmond for February 2012 included 2 thefts from cars, 3 vehicle thefts, 6 residential burglaries, and other assorted incidents. There were no violent crimes reported.
- **5. Report on Membership (Sue Rosenof 510-599-1197)** Membership renewals are coming in and are being moved over to the 2012-2013 year. April is beginning of the PRNC calendar year.
- **6. Treasurer's Report (Louise Fender-510-260-0309)** Balance Forward: \$5,880.70; Expenses: \$21.80; Dues collected: \$130, Bishop Alley Fund: \$711.06; Ferry Point Fund: \$1,989.58; Wig Wag Fund: \$2,970.94; General Fund: \$5,988.90 **Total Balance: \$11,660.48**
- 7. Committee Reports and Announcements from Non-Profit Groups
 - Women's Westside Improvement Club (Linda Newton) Meets at the Methodist Church on the 1st--Tuesday of March at11:30 am. Bring bag lunch. Dessert and drinks provided.
 - Knit and Such (Altha Humphrey 510-232-2934) Will meet at March 7 in Community Center from 12:30-2:30 pm. All welcome.
 - Arts of Point Richmond (Altha Humphrey) The Spring Art show will be Tuesday, March 20 from 6-9 pm in the Community Center.
 - Red Oak Victory Ship (George Coles) George recommends coming to see the USS Iowa
 and then touring the Red Oak Victory Ship. Need more docents to lead tours (tours
 include 10 flights of stairs). Contact George or the crew in the gift shop for a training
 tour.
 - Friends of Richmond Tennis (Garry Hurlbut glh@tai.org) The City council approved the expenditure to resurface Nichol Park and Plunge courts. Expect completion by the April. They have great youth program. There will be an adult tennis program. Also have space for community garden. Can apply to city to adopt an area.
 - Point Richmond History Association (Mid Dornan 510-234-5334) Newsletter is out and is available at Santa Fe or Point markets. Have some free calendars left. As part of the 100 year Washington School celebration, past presidents are being honored. Nominations for the annual Historic Preservation wards are due by March 30.

- **8. Report from Land Use Design Review Committee** Items to be considered at the Committee's April 25 meeting must be submitted to Rod Satre, Committee Chair, by April 10th. Contact Rod at 510-232-5059 or rdsatre@live.com
- 9. Caltrans Project Scofield Ave. Bridge Deck Replacement Project (Gary Purcell (gpurcell@dot.ca.gov; Allyn Amsk (allyn_amsk@dot.ca.gov)) Presentation was in response to various community concerns about a multi-year closure of the Western Drive Eastbound onramp from Point Molate that would have required an 11 mile detour across the bridge and back. Caltrans has proposed a new plan which will shorten the Western Ave ramp part of the project to 3 months and has put in place measures to allow almost all cars (except oversized and trucks) to avoid the detour. An estimated 40 vehicles will have to use the detour during the night. Toll passes will be available for these 40 cars.

For more details contact Amsk or plan to attend a community education session which will be held before the project begins. Several members made an unrelated suggestion that the Fastrak lanes be switched to the right side of the toll plaza. A PRNC resolution to recommend this idea will be discussed at a future meeting.

10. Childhood Obesity Epidemic, Jeff Ritterman, City Council (jeffritterman@yahoo.com) Dr. Ritterman described the current childhood obesity epidemic, which if not reversed, will result in huge increases in adult obesity, illness, mortality and social costs. Children cannot be blamed for their obesity. He likened the issue as both an individual and social problem similar to tobacco use, which must be addressed at the society level. The problem will disproportionately affect poor communities of color. Many studies point to a great increase in fructose (sugar consumption) as the cause, primarily through increased consumption of sweetened sodas. Dr. Ritterman is encouraging individuals and groups to join with the Richmond Fit for Life Coalition to participate in develop activities to promote a healthy Richmond through healthy eating programs, physical fitness programs, etc.

In addition, the City Council has recommended two measures for the November ballot. The first will levy a 1 cent/ounce tax on sweetened sodas. The second will designate that monies raised be used to support a healthy Richmond—more play fields, nutrition programs, etc. To address concern about Richmond citizens will go to neighboring cities to buy sodas, Dr. Ritterman described attempts in the works to have similar taxes in surrounding cities. 
11. Public Forum

- Joe Puleo announced the petition drive to get the Millionaires Tax on the ballot. The initiative raises the money exclusively from those who make \$1,000,000 or more annually and allocates the money to schools, social services, and infrastructure improvements.
- There will be an International Fair at Washington Elementary School Friday, March 23.
- Linda Newton reminded us that Peter had resurrected the custom of closing the meetings in honor of Point Richmond residents who had recently died. Linda announced the recent death of Marie Miller who passed away in January from a brain tumor. Marie worked hard to improve the garden in the triangle area by the library. She also announced the death of Betty Dornan, longtime Richmond resident.

Several people talked about Peter Minkwitz, remembering his commitment to the PRNC, his kind, rational, articulate ways, his willingness to work hard for Point Richmond, his involvement in large and small community issues.

12. The meeting was adjourned at 9 pm in memory of Betty Dornan, Marie Miller, and Peter Minkwitz.
