"Final" Tunnel Update (hopefully). Work on the "void" on the tunnel ceiling is scheduled to be completed during the week of August 19, followed by new striping and signage the week of August 26. The City Engineering Department is projecting that the tunnel will be opening sometime during the week of September 9.

### Interesting Topics at the Next PRNC Meeting: Wednesday, August 28, 7:30 pm, Pt. Richmond **Community Center**

- We will discuss what information we would like in the monthly police report.
- The LUDRC will provide an overview of the basic program for plans at Terminal One. At this time, no formal drawings or exact layouts are expected. The PRNC can expect a multiple number of meetings with the developer over time. The negotiations with the City of Richmond (Property Owner) are still a work in progress but the developer has an exclusive relationship (contingent on a meeting of the minds and acceptance of their proposed project) at this time.
- Julie Wedge, Public Relations Director of Campus California, will describe this excellent program that promotes recycling of useable items. We plan to make this program available at periodic membership meetings.
- What lives beneath the bay's briny waters? Much more than you can ever imagine! Chris Lim, from the Watershed Project's Living Shoreline Program will talk about his oyster restoration work along the San Francisco Bay shoreline. Chris needs volunteers and will entice you to help out with some photos of the project.
- Richmond has received national press as the first city in the country to adopt a new program to keep families in their homes and reduce blight in neighborhoods. The city is offering to buy specific underwater mortgages from banks and other mortgage lenders at prices reflecting near current market value of the houses. If the offers are refused, the City will use the power of "eminent domain" to avoid blight by taking over the mortgages at current market value and refinancing the revalued mortgages with the current homeowners. The banks are very concerned about this approach to avoiding blight by keeping homeowners in their homes. Come to hear more and discuss the program.

# General Meeting Minutes Wednesday, July 31, 2013

- 1. The meeting was called to order at 7:33pm
- 2. Minutes of June 26, 2013 meeting were approved.
- **3. Police Report (Officer Yesinia Rogers <u>yrogers@richmondpd.net</u> or 510-621-1212 x-1715) (Non-emergency number for police assistance 510-233-1214). Officer Dave Longacre reporting for Officer Rogers. In July there were 22 crimes reported. Auto thefts and auto burglaries appear to have increased recently. Officer Longacre reminded us to call if we see anything suspicious and also mentioned that there is a Predictive Policing program being implemented to help officers focus on predicted areas of where and when crimes are likely to occur.**
- **4. President's Report (Margaret Jordan, President 510-412-3673)** Margaret mentioned that PRNC Board is planning a retreat in September or October to discuss the direction of the PRNC and ways of continuing to contribute to our community. She reported that the clean up day was a success bringing in \$288.75 and disposing of 11.53 tons of debris! Margaret reminded members to attend the Planning Commission meeting to support the Formula Restaurant Ordinance. She mentioned the National Night Out that will be on August 5. The tunnel is now slated to be opening in 6 to 8 weeks. August 23 will be a march for Operation Ceasefire. She will post further information on Nextdoor.com.
- **5. Membership Report (Charmain Tyler 510-334-7267)** Currently there are 153 paid members. Membership drive continues and we will soon have postcards for members to hand out to other Point Richmond residents to encourage joining the PRNC. We are only as strong as our membership!
- **6. Treasurer's Report (Garry Hurlbut 510-547-8111)** General Fund \$8708.09, Bishop Alley Fund \$711.06 and WigWag Fund \$2,970.94(for which we are custodians) **Total Balance: \$12,390.09**
- 7. Report from Land Use Design Review Committee No report.

- **8. Environmentally Friendly Garden Pest Control (Lynne Scarpa, Manager, Richmond Stormwater Control)** Lynne announced that there will be a clean up at Keller Beach on September 21<sup>st</sup>. She went on to talk to us about environmentally friendly pest control and stressed that their focus is to have residents be careful about the pesticides that they put in their gardens and lawns as to reduce the run off into our waterways. She discussed safer ways to maintain homes and gardens without affecting other plants, animals, and waterways. Integrated Pest Management (IPM) is the acronym she used, and she provided us with handouts on natural pesticides, as well as tips for dealing with gophers, skunks and raccoons. These can be found on the UCIPM website out of UC Davis. She said that reducing food, water and shelter areas for these pests helps to make your home less appealing to them.

- **9. Meet Kory Judd, New General Manager at Chevron Refinery** Mr. Judd has been an employee of Chevron for 27 years, 9 of them here in Richmond. He is happy to be in Richmond and reports that the refinery is back to normal operation following the fire in 2012. He was asked if anything has changed since the fire and he mentioned significant changes in inspections are in place. He was asked about the air quality monitors, which are operational on the fence line, but not in the community. Placement of the monitors continues to be in the works. October 5 is the Community Day, and he encouraged members to visit Chevron then. When asked about future plans, he stated that being the best company, offering the best product to customers, is what he strives for.
- **10.** Richmond Public Library Foundation Book Van Campaign (Sandi Genser-Mack) The Foundation has set a goal of raising \$100,000 for a book van and associated costs. A bookmobile already exists and needs help. A book van is more agile, and can get to places the bookmobile cannot. Truly bringing the library to the community. To learn more and donate go to ww.rplf.org. It was mentioned that this might be something the PRNC would be interested in helping out with.
- 11. Update on Formula Restaurant Ordinance (Linda Newton) Draft of the ordinance has been completed and the PRNC Committee and the PRBA have met and come to an agreement on the draft of the ordinance that will go to the Planning Commission August 1. Members are encouraged to attend the meeting and speak on its' behalf. Margaret emphasized that this is not a given and that community support is needed to move this through.
