## Point Richmond Neighborhood Council General Meeting Minutes Wednesday, April 26, 2017

- Called to Order at 7:08 pm. Minutes from the previous meeting on March 22, 2017 were approved with no amendments. Board Members present: Dave Schoenthal, Jordan Destabler, Charmain Tyler, Garry Hurlbut, and Hilary Brown
- 2. President's Report and State of the Point address, Dave Schoenthal: Looking back on the last year, there has been a lot of community involvement by the PRNC and our members. PRNC hosted a debate for measure N, assisted with the downtown holiday lights, we hosted a soils day workshop and launched the new Sustainability Web Page. Thank you to all the people who have helped volunteer throughout the community. Looking forward, the PRNC is assisting with the planning for Picnic in the Point, scheduled for September 9<sup>th</sup>. We continue to explore the odor issues at Republic Services, we are continuing to communicate with developers for the Quarry Project and we look forward to working with the city to develop traffic and parking solutions. Our PRNC forum is important because it allows us to meet up face to face, share ideas, and get to know each other. Our vision for the next year is to continue to break down the walls that separate us. We will take steps to make the PRNC a 501(c)(3) organization. I would like to take steps to make membership more inclusive and extend our inclusivity to everyone throughout the city. I would also like to recruit more community members to be members of the board, and to participate in special projects. Together we can build a more inclusive community.
- 3. Treasurer's Report, Garry Hurlbut: We received \$120 in new member dues. We paid out \$100 for the special meeting. Our current balances are: \$2,213.96 Benevolent Fund, \$2,970.94 Wig Wag Fund, \$3,249.05 General Fund.
- **4. Report on Membership, Charmain Tyler:** My term serving as VP of membership is coming to a close. I enjoyed getting to know people, and I look forward to continue working with the PRNC for special projects. Currently we have 124 paid members. May 1<sup>st</sup> is the beginning of the fiscal year and membership dues are due April 30<sup>th</sup> for the next year. Dues are \$10 for an individual, \$15 for family, \$500 for lifetime membership.
- 5. Elections for Treasurer, First Vice President, and Second Vice President:
  - Position of Treasurer: The board nominated Jordan DeStabler for the position of Treasurer.
  - First Vice President: The board nominated Garry Hurlbut to take over the position of First VP for the last year of the two year term.
  - Both nominations were approved with unanimous support.
  - Position of Second Vice President of Membership: The board nominated June Hight for this position. She has
    lived in the Point since 2005, she became a mom to an adorable baby girl in January, and she and her husband
    enjoy walking their dogs around the Point. Nomination was approved with unanimous support.
  - o Dave appointed Charmain to be the member-at-large in charge of special committees
- 6. Aaron Winer from Veolia: Gave a short history of odor issues from the wastewater treatment plant and addressed concerns about the monitoring H2S (Hydrogen Sulphide) stations. During 2010 and 2011 there were plant operational issues, maintenance issues, and some major odor issues. In 2011 the city installed 5 monitors and in late 2011 Veolia settled with the DA and installed the 6<sup>th</sup> monitor. H2S is everywhere in sewers and wastewater. It is commonly called sewer gas or swamp gas. The monitors that were installed detect these gasses around the plant and send alerts to operators when detected levels exceed 22 ppb. Plant operators will respond when levels reach 30 ppb (permit requires a response at 60 ppb). There should be 6 monitors, but currently two are pulled down for rehabilitation. Typically there is a spike in odor at the start of the rainy season when sewers get flushed out and in spring the detection levels fall back down. There are multiple improvements at the plant that are almost complete including: headworks and bar screen area in the wet well. This pulls debris like sticks and rags out of waste stream. The wet well then uses duct works to move dirty gasses through a bio scrubber, which is 50ft by 150ft pad with wood chips. The monitoring system we installed was a pilot system, and although it worked it was becoming less reliable over time. The original vendor did not provide support for the equipment, so there is a new subcontractor fixing the system. They are exploring other providers to do installation and maintenance and are working to get the meters back online as soon as possible.
- 7. Land Use Design Review Committee: 2 projects. Change of location. There are two applicants. LUDRC voted to approve the applications.
  - 44 Montana Street: LUDRC approved with conditions that new work complements historic sections of house, window look matches other similar homes, basement has adequate ventilation. Motion to approve project passed with unanimous support.

- 50 Nicholl: LUDRC approved with conditions that drainage at lower elevations are addressed, work complements historic sections and windows of house, water permeable landscaping used, and to return within 5 years to provide information about the garage door. Motion to approve project was passed with unanimous approval.
- **8. Parking Committee:** There have been ongoing discussions about how to improve parking in the business district and how to implement the new parking permit program. We would like to start a new parking committee; if interested please send an email to Dave.

- Richmond Tennis, Garry Hurlbut: This program grew into a city-wide program that started from a vision to fix the tennis courts at the Plunge. Program includes tot's tennis at 9am on Saturday for 2-8 year olds. We also support youth programs throughout the City, we encourage healthy snacks, teamwork, and more.
- TRAC: Atlas Road Bridge, Dotson Family Marsh and new park entrance were completed allowing bikes to travel from the Point to Point Pinole.
