Board Members present:

Peter Thelin, President Dave Bleckinger, 1st Vice President June Hight, Membership Chair and 2nd VP Charmain Tyler, Secretary Buzz Baylis, Treasurer Garry Hurlbut, Member at Large

1. Call to order and approval of minutes, Peter Thelin

Meeting called to order at 7:30 pm via Zoom. Minutes were approved. No objections or changes.

2. President's report, Peter Thelin

Peter reviewed the action packed agenda.

3. Treasurer's report, Buzz Baylis

We brought in close to \$500 in dues this month. New balance \$4,200.

4. Membership report, June Hight

We now have 64 active members. You can click on the link on our website to pay your dues.

5. Update on NextDoor, Facebook, PayPal Accounts, and the PRNC Website, June Hight, Buzz Baylis Our NextDoor account is back on. We are adding some other documents for emergency and safety.

PayPal is now working, and the money is transferred correctly. Our old Facebook account has been deleted because we are not using it.

6. Recap of Halloween scavenger hunt and costume contest, June Hight

Partnering with PRAM went well. Many neighbors put out decorations and kids saw their decorations on the scavenger hunt list. You can see photos on website. Prizes were given for local businesses, keeping it in the community.

7. Gateway Foundation, Martin McNair, Margi Celluci

The Gateway Foundation has been active for at least 8 years, when the Mechanics Bank moved into the old railroad depot. There is an agreement to use the rent for grants to nonprofits in the community. Checks are given up to \$5,000.

Some of the grantees are:

Masquers, Changing Tides, Marine Research, Arts of Point Richmond, Read Aloud, Washington Elementary School, Point Richmond History Association, two churches, Point Richmond Summer Music, and PR CERT.

Discussion about how organizations are chosen.

Some organizations expressed their thanks:

- PR CERT: We will buy some emergency supplies and radios.
- Masquers: We will buy a new, green lighting system.
- Arts of Point Richmond is supporting the group called Taking it Outside. They have put up 28 banners all over town.
- First Methodist Church will put in new speakers.
- Read Aloud will give books to children.
- Washington Elementary will pay for the music program and the garden program.
- Point Richmond History Association will put more brass plaques up on historic buildings.

8. Community Briefs, Part 1

- *Masquers Playhouse, Carl Smith, <u>www.masquers.org</u> Thanks for promoting the virtual festival. Over 400 people tuned in and gave over \$3,000.*
- *Point Richmond Table Tennis Club, Peter Thelin* Table tennis is challenged by Covid, but we are playing with fun and vigor.

• Richmond Tennis, Garry Hurlbut

They no longer have regular tennis matches because of Covid. They only play singles. Now only household members can be on the court together. Look on the fence at the courts and you will see the names of who won previous matches. They have done gardening around the Plunge. Garry is the door manager for the Zoom meeting. If you sign up as PRNC members it will be easy to let you in. He can only let you in if he has your names.

• Women's Westside Improvement Club, Diane Diani

New garden committee chair: Marlee Prutten. WWIC takes care of rose garden and Map garden. Will be requesting some funding for more garden improvements.

9. Land Use Design Review Committee, Charmain Tyler

700 Ocean Ave, Lot line adjustment

This is a large lot, owned by one family. They want to make two parcels so they can build a 2nd house. It was discussed by the LUDRC and plans were accepted as is. LUDRC approved this request, 6-0. PRNC general membership voted to approve. None opposed.

10. Update on Homeless Parking Issue

• Leisa Johnson

City staff met with community re: sites for RV parking. They have identified and are reviewing 40 sites in regard to proximity of services, water, lighting, and fencing. In January City staff will recommend 5 - 10 sites. Leisa is working with the City and County to identify vacant lots. We need to find usable, workable solutions.

• Daniel Barth, SOS (Safe Organized Spaces)

We need to have agreement that we need to get folks from the freeways and the train tracks and into spaces that are safe, have electricity, water and fencing. They all need to be paved so vehicles can drive and park. Daniel has been involved with the Planning Dept for 6-8 months. They are also looking at private sites. They are looking at a one year timeline. They are also looking at shelters and places for sleeping. Daniel is also very involved in cleaning up areas near freeways and BART. It's important to note they are training people to clean up after themselves.

• Margi noted that SOS received Gateway funding through Friends of Recreation.

11. Community Briefs, Part 2

• **PR CERT,** Kristen Gates, <u>kristen@prcert.org</u>

They are working to create a strong CERT organization to help out in time of natural disaster. They are preparing for emergency at the neighborhood level. The City is now offering CERT training online. Look at the website for more information: prcert.org

Charmain added that they will soon be bringing in a container to use as their base of operations. Also, they are currently doing radio training.

• *Point Richmond History Association, Bonnie Jo Cullison, <u>http://pointrichmondhistory.org</u> Because the museum had to close temporarily, they put up display boards in the windows. They also put a screen in the front window which shows many photos. They will insert new panels in the kiosk in January.*

• Arts of Point Richmond, Mary Lee, artsofpointrichmond.com

There is a new exhibit in the post office with local impressionistic scenes. Taking it Outdoors has been a perfect way to show art during the pandemic. Bob published a book of his photographs and his writings. The Annual Christmas Fair will be online. We have over 100 members now. We hope to turn Point Richmond into an arts destination. Please check out our website. We have jewelry, paintings, and photographs online.

• *TRAC, Richmond Bay Trail, Bruce Beyaert, <u>www.pointrichmond.com/baytrail</u> There is no representative from TRAC here today, but Garry Hurlbutt wanted to say that TRAC will be given \$2 million for work on the Bay Trail at Point Molate.*

• **PRAM**, Crissy

They are wrapping up the year with a Share the Peace event. They made cards for frontline healthcare workers and seniors with Meals on Wheels. With community pressure, they managed to get playgrounds open again.

12. Public Forum

- Charmain Tyler asked for a big shout out to Sue Rosenof for all the good work on the kiosk and newsletter, even when she just got out of the hospital.
- June Hight said the City will check the lights for the bike path at Garrard and Canal. A bicyclist was hit and killed there. The traffic light is too short. Traffic is turning left across you if you are on a bike.

13. In Remembrance and Celebration

- Charmain's niece Cheryl has Coronavirus. She has been in bed for 11 days and has deep fatigue, bad headaches and painful, burning lungs. Your good, healing thoughts are appreciated.
- Garry said his friend had a baby, named Walter Mack Blackletter. Born 2 weeks ago.
- Dave's grandmother turned 101 but she got Coronavirus and, sadly, she passed away.
