Our Point is becoming quite the film location, it seems.

Earlier this week I met with Felix Gehm. He was the fellow responsible for the Honda commercial filmed in downtown Point Richmond way back in 2019. This time he's planning to shoot a commercial for the recruitment agency Indeed, in front of El Sol Restaurant. Filming on Sunday, May 23 will be from 4 to 7 pm and just on the sidewalk. The streets will remain open as usual.

And Wednesday I heard from Chris Babb, the production manager on a new real estate TV show that will be filming at a residence next week (primarily inside the house, but a few exteriors and possibly a drone to get an aerial view). Chris promised there will be little to no impact on the neighborhood.

Back in March I had a meeting at Kaleidoscope Coffee with Alex Hinxmann about a small independent film he'd just gotten the permit to shoot in the Point around the beginning of June.

Present from PRNC:

Peter Thelin, President David Bleckinger, 1st Vice President June Hight, Membership Chair Buzz Baylis, Treasurer Charmain Tyler, Secretary Garry Hurlbut, Member-at-Large Sue Rosenof, Member-at-Large

Meeting called to order at 7:33 p.m. Garry is having technical difficulties and will be listening through a cell phone. As people log in they will be muted. If you want to speak, click on raise your hand.

1. Call to order and approval of minutes from April.

Move to approve. Seconded. Vote - all in favor; Opposed: none. Motion passes.

2. Police Report, Officer Walton Don Nelson, Beat 1

With department for 14 years. Eight stolen vehicles this year, one recovered in Pt. Richmond. There were 5 assaults, 4 domestic. There were 4 commercial burglaries and 1 grand theft.

- Cordell said he noticed some activity around the park area. Is it possible to have more patrols? Officer Nelson said there is not a lot we can do. People sleep in their vehicles and in parks. Officer Nelson said their goal is to offer services and see what we can do to help. We give citations for misdemeanors but then they are free to go back to the same area.
- June said there has been some chat on NextDoor about the Memorial Day sale. We had a lot of
 people dumping mounds of garbage in Judge Carroll Park. If it didn't sell they would just leave it.
 Officer Nelson asked June to send him an email. He can contact the beat officer. Maybe on
 NextDoor you could organize a campaign to tell people not to dump. You can call the nonemergency number.
- Jesse had a question about some dangerous illegal activity. Police used to offer services to the homeless. Now it seems like a drive by. The Contra Costa outreach people came and offered outreach services and helped out. Officer Nelson said officers drive by and don't necessarily make contact. Get in touch with dispatch center.
- Jesse asked what we can we do about the loud mufflers speeding through The Point. Officer Nelson said they have a traffic unit. Officers can take action for loud noise or street action. We are facing a cut of 25 officers and we are already down officers. The traffic and noise are harder and harder for us to monitor because of more urgent crime. Jesse said when the first pedestrian is killed by the Plunge then it will reach a critical point. Officer Nelson said he is not trying to devalue that. Yesterday we had 2 homicides. That takes away from us doing the proactive traffic problems.
- Fran said the Masquers used to do the Memorial Day sale. Maybe PRNC could put some signs up that say no sales this year.
- Peter suggested a speed bump to keep people from racing through the tunnel.
- Officer Nelson said he would talk to the beat officers.
- Amanda said there are cyclists who don't know to go on the bike path through the tunnel.
- Officer Nelson offered his email: wnelson@richmondpd.net. He works nights, Monday-Thursday.

3. **President's Report,** Peter Thelin Peter gave us the link to the City budget talks. There was a lot of interest in the FAA and changing the Oakland Airport flight path to fly over Richmond. But that's not happening. We have reached out to Tawfic Hallaby to talk about the parklets and the speed bump, but we have not heard back from him. Peter will reach out to the new person in charge, Joe Leach.

4. Treasurer's Report, Buzz Baylis

This is Buzz's last Treasurer's Report. We brought in \$140 in dues, \$70 was from PayPal. We gave out 2 checks: one to Mona for developing the new website; and one to WWIC for the garden project.

5. Membership Report, June Hight

We have 124 members – a little below average. 24 have paid for May 1st, the beginning of the next PRNC year. You can pay on PayPal on the website. I will continue to work on the website.

6. Egg Hunt follow up, June Hight

It went really well. Not as many participants as Halloween. We sent out 9 or 10 gift cards. PRAM is taking care of that part. Neighbors were good about putting a colored egg in the window.

7. Elections for Board Positions, Peter Thelin

Buzz Baylis was nominated for Membership Chair and Margi Sullivan was nominated for Treasurer. Vote for Buzz Baylis for Membership Chair – In favor: All; Opposed: None

Vote was in favor of Buzz to become Membership Chair

Vote for Margi Sullivan for Treasurer – In favor: All but 1; Abstain: 1; Opposed: None *Vote was in favor of Margi to become Treasurer*.

8. Thank you and good-bye to June Hight for a great job as Membership Chair. Peter spoke about June's good work. She is the glue that holds this together. June said it has been a pleasure. Thank you for the opportunity. Peter offered a dinner invitation to June and Howard when they are ready.

9. Community Briefs, Part 1

• Masquers Playhouse, Frances Smith

They are still waiting to see when they can open. Green low energy lights have been installed.

Peter cancelled the last 2 meetings. We might move back to the Riggers Loft to have more room. He reached out to the East Brothers Brewery to see if they are going to have their car show. They don't know yet. They do have a rec league and they have ping pong.

There were 45 participants at the last meeting. The presentation was about what is going on in the city. We also talked about pickleball. The next meeting is May 10.

Project at 700 Ocean Ave., New house. LUDRC voted to support this project, as presented with no conditions. Joshua, the architect for this project, showed some of the plans on the screen. PRNC membership vote: To support the project. In favor: All; Opposed: None. Motion passes.

12. Gardening in The Point, Women's Westside Improvement Club, Marlee Prutten They had a successful day of gardening at the Indian Statue Garden about 6 weeks ago. Funding was from PRNC. They bought materials from local businesses, like Annie's Annuals. They had about 12 volunteers. There is another group in May. They are going to do a workday every quarter. They worked for 5 hours and would like to hire someone to help with the weeding.

13. Community Briefs, Part 2

 - PR CERT is the group in Point Richmond working on emergency preparedness. Anyone is invited to join us in our activities. We are working on getting supplies for the container. We continue to practice using the radios to be prepared for emergencies. We have emergency scenarios to help simulate a real emergency.

- Don Woodrow said The Point at night feels like a morgue. The Mac is closed. The center of our town is a dark hole. I come in at 7:00 a.m. for coffee at Little Louis' and I haven't seen anyone from the PRNC there. At 2:00 p.m. there is nothing going on.
 - Some discussion about various restaurants in The Point.
 - Jesse commented that noontime is very active. Masa is doing really well. They are good neighbors. They go out and clean up every day.
- Cordell said he has 2 ideas for future topics. Management Partners can talk about budget principles. Laura Snideman can give us a better understanding of how our city is functioning.

16. In Remembrance and Celebration

Dave Bleckinger said his father, Robert Arthur Bleckinger, survived cancer for 3 years. He was fully vaccinated, but he passed away from Covid on April 11. He will be missed by his family.
