- 2. Police Report: Not in attendance.
- 3. **President's Report,** Peter Thelin: One big topic that I have been letting slide is in person meetings. People have asked when we are going to have in person meetings. Some people do not have a computer. This is my last meeting because I am terming out. I have learned so much. It has been really rewarding for me. I am sure that you will be in good hands moving forward.
- 4. Nominating Committee, Charmain Tyler: This is PRNC's annual meeting. Every year some of the board positions come available. This year it is the position of President, Vice President, and Secretary. The nominating committee has met and have 3 nominees to recommend. The PRNC members will vote for these positions. You do have to be a member to vote.

Here are the nominees for these 3 positions: For president, Phil Rosenthal For vice president, Leisa Johnson For secretary, Peter Thelin

Dave will handle the actual election and voting. Dave thanked the nominating committee for the 3 nominees for the 3 positions for the board. He checked the bylaws, and it does say that nominations can come from the floor at the last minute. Are there any members who would like to nominate someone for any of these positions?

Peter thanked Dave for being an incredible vice president and thanked Charmain for being a wonderful secretary. Garry and Charmain really helped. And June and Hilary. There are so many great talented people in The Point. Margi added that Charmain did a great bunny hop at the Spring Fling. She was amazing.

#### 5. Treasurer's Report, Margi Sullivan

We are in great shape financially. I will be picking up the check tomorrow for the \$2500 from the Gateway Foundation. Along with the Mechanics bank, and the new memberships, that brings the total to around \$22,100. Peter reminded us that we will get money from the cannabis company by this time next year.

#### 6. **Membership Report,** Buzz Baylis

Adding to the joyous news from Margi, we picked up 40 new-to-us members. We've had about 30 renewed. With our mailing, the Art Walk, and the Spring Fling, we have had a good month. Phil said thank you to Charmain and Margi and said that 3 of his neighbors signed up just after the Spring Fling. All 3 of them are young families.

#### 7. **Spring Fling,** Dave Bleckinger

This was our 3rd annual Spring Fling. Dave said he was very busy with the events and serving food. Thank you to all the board members for contributing. We had between 80 and 100 people attending. We couldn't do it for a couple years, then had to push it off for one week to get better weather. We got new members and had a lot of positive feedback from everyone. This is a community event. If you like it you can join, too.

We had a tennis demo, live band, free pizza, oranges, and apple sauce. Free beer, juice, and water. We had face painting. The kids participated in egg hunt and 2 kinds of egg races. We had a hat contest. Someone said we should have an adult and kid division for the hat contest. We also had a raffle. There were many generous donations. East Brother donated the beer. It was a fantastic event. Thank you all for attending. We had 15 pizzas, 40 waters, 50 juices, bags of oranges, and a bunch of smashed eggs! Peter said it was entertaining to watch Dave give complicated directions to the kids.

Garry said it was great to see the young people out. Phil said it was surprising to see how many kids participated in the tennis demo. It was great.

Dave added that Garry and Maryn made the venue available and made sure it was all cleaned up and ready. Phil strung up the little flags. Charmain decorated with the pompoms. Sue did the graphics for the signs and flyers.

#### 8. Community Briefs, Part 1

- **PR CERT**, Charmain Tyler (510) 334-7267 charmain.tyler@gmail.com; Sunday, May 1, Emergency Drill, 11:00 to 1:00 in the park. We will be working with radios, search and rescue exercises, triage, and first aid. We will have a training fire extinguisher to practice using, and a training gas meter to practice gas shut off. You can be involved in the CERT drill activities, or you can volunteer as a victim. PR CERT = Point Richmond Community Emergency Response Team.
- **Point Richmond Business Association**, Cordell Hindler, pointrichmondbusiness.com Karen Buchanan is on the Board of the PRBA and she spoke. The next mixer will be Wednesday, May 18, at 4:30, at El Sol. The Baltic Spice House is permanently closed. There was a dispute between the partners. It's now available for a new restaurant.
- **Point Richmond History Association**, Bonnie Jo Cullison, pointrichmondhistory.org Karen Buchanan spoke about the annual membership meeting on the 3rd Sunday in May. This is the first in person membership meeting in 2 years.
- Arts of Point Richmond, Mary Lee Cole, artsofpointrichmond.com
  The AOPR continues to thrive. First annual stroll was on April 3. It was a lot of fun and very successful. Margi's gallery had a spectacular opening. We got new members. 17 fresh new Taking It Outdoors banners were installed. We are working on the kids'
  Taking It Outdoors with Washington School. People are bringing in a lot of art material for the kids. We have great photos on website. We're putting together a policy for solo and small group shows. A new artist will be showing in Kaleidoscope.
- Magick Lantern, Kate Spaulding MagickLantern.org, magick-lantern@att.net, (510)232-2559. Kate is astounded at being able to open the second Saturday in May. The enormous amount of effort was helped by my going to Margi. It was going to be \$751 for the Community Center. I have been working on this for almost a year. A fee waiver was proposed but it did not go through. And now we have a place at the Methodist Church. Thank you to Margi for helping me get over this. I don't yet have a picture picked out. We are still negotiating.
- **PRAM**, Christine Bradley, pram.net; new president is Katherine Otis. Mom of one and new homeowner in PR. Working with Washington School, doing crafts after school. We hope to do a relay race this summer and use the park without dogs. We would like to hold events at the school. Open to co-sponsoring an event with PRNC.
- **HOA's in Point Richmond**; Leisa Johnson said the major thing is about PG&E development. The DRB should have been tonight. The application was incomplete so DRB chair postponed it. I will let you know when it comes back on the agenda. There is going to be a lot to address.
- 9. Land Use Design Review Committee (LUDRC), Charmain Tyler

There are no projects this month. Charmain announced a new LUDRC member, David Cole. He has been on committees, organizations and boards before and was President of Masquers. He and Mary Lee have participated in PRNC and have been members.

David said he has always been interested in architecture and learning more about it. He understands property issues and view issues. He has lived in different places in Point Richmond and knows some of the neighborhoods in different areas. Welcome

10. Chevron: New Project: Richmond Energy Plaza, Hakim Johnson Hakim sends Peter a text if there is something going on at Chevron. He is here to talk about the Richmond Energy Plaza, exciting for Richmond. Chevron has been taking on new projects and moving toward net zero to reduce emissions. A big component is the hydrogen plant. There is a green hydrogen project going on at Republic Services site. Richmond Chevron is on the brink of leading on alternative fuels. The fuels need to be able to be distributed to vessels, cars, passenger vehicles, trucks. The Energy Plaza is a renewable natural gas and hydrogen station.

Olu Adeoye was introduced. He has been with Chevron for 4 years. A mile north of the refinery is an old fertilizer plant that has been closed. We want to put in a beautiful facility there to refuel 100 small vehicles per day, like UPS or USPS vehicles.

John Sakamoto, the project director, was introduced. He showed some slides showing a conceptual view with vehicles fueling compressed natural gas under one canopy and smaller commercial vehicles fueling with hydrogen under another canopy.

This site is located off the Richmond Parkway near Castro Street intersection. The site is empty and the prior structures and equipment are gone. The vehicles that come to the new site might be Toyota Mirai, which uses hydrogen fuel.

#### Q & A:

Kate: How long does it take to fill up a car? It seems there is more opportunity for trucks than cars.

Olu: The predominant passenger vehicle now is the Toyota Mirai. We can fill one kilogram per minute. The storage in the Mirai will be 6 kilograms, so that would be 6 minutes. For the larger trucks, they will have 30 kilograms of storage and it will take 20 to 30 minutes to fill us. Both will be able to be fueled simultaneously.

Leisa: Is the fueling time the same for natural gas and for hydrogen? What is the timeline for building this facility?

Olu: The fueling time for hydrogen will be 5 or 6 minutes. The basis of the design is to be similar to regular gas fueling.

Dave: How is hydrogen going to be sourced? What is footprint in compared to gas car? Olu: There will be less carbon dioxide in the environment. Worst-case scenario, get hydrogen from fracking. You will have carbon dioxide in that process, but less than from burning gasoline in vehicle. We would buy from companies that are producing hydrogen. Chevron is investing in a bio-methane project in Richmond. The methane is from landfill. Some will come to facility also. That will have negative carbon effect.

Hakim: There are existing 3rd party suppliers out there now. We will also have joint partners. The emissions from using hydrogen are zero emissions from the fuel.

Peter: Speak to the conversion or equivalency of kilograms vs. gallons of gas.

Olu: If you put everything together including cost, the closest measure is using 5 gallons of gas. On advanced model, you can compare 18 miles to one kg. Moves faster. It's quieter. There is more fuel efficiency. With 5 kgs you can go 80 miles per kg, about 400 miles for a full tank, using the Toyota Mirai as example.

Phil: Is Chevron's attempt to capture methane going to be at our own methane processing place? Or does it have to be transported?

Hakim: This is still being explored at this time. It is not a reality yet.

Olu: We are looking at supporting a local place for hydrogen production.


- Masquers Playhouse, Francis Smith, masquers.org. Not here.
- Richmond Neighborhood Coordinating Council, Cordell Hindler, There was a big turnout of about 52 people. The Finance Department talked about the budget process. The Arts and Cultural division from city manager's office also spoke. The next meeting is May 9 at 7 pm via zoom. Phil asked if there was funding for art projects in each neighborhood? Yes. Maybe we need funding for an art mural. Maybe that is something that we could tap into.
- Richmond Tennis and Hurlbutt Benevolent Fund, Garry and Maryn Hurlbutt, 501-547-8111; John did a great job at the Spring Fling working with the kids. He does lessons for youth and adults. If you need lessons, call me. We did finish the courts at MLK park. Resurfaced 2 courts there. We do a lot of summer work there with the kids. Maryn is coordinating Willie May's Day, May 21st, and Hands Across the Bay. He is 91 years old. We are dedicating a plaque at Nichol Park. He did a lot with the March of Dimes with kids in Richmond. Maryn is coordinating with Mayor Breed from SF and Mayor Butt. Willie Mays Park will be dedicated.
- **USS Red Oak Victory Ship,** Graham Perrett, redoakvictory.us; Karen Buchanan spoke. We are kicking off the pancake breakfast for Mothers' Day. The ship is still floating. We need to get the ship dry docked and we will be doing fundraising for that. They are still welding the rough spots.
- Women's Westside Improvement Club, Diane Diani pointrichmond.com/wwic Mary Lee Cole reported. There will be the annual fundraiser this Tuesday, Bunko. It's crazy fun. Money from fundraiser goes to general fund. The money goes to local St. Vincent de Paul to help homeless people, and the Richmond emergency food pantry. We continue to have garden days. We had 10-15 people sign up for new membership. Phil has been weeding out the tree wells by the library. There is a program where the city will reimburse for bagged mulch. I remember the park chair saying there was some money for supplies.
- Richmond Table Tennis, Peter Thelin, pthelin1@yahoo.com Point San Pablo Yacht Club on Mondays from 5 to 8 o'clock. Cheapest drinks in East Bay. Some enthusiastic players. People are learning fast. No charge but donations are accepted. It's good exercise. You can bring food to share. You don't have to play. Just come and talk and make new friends.

#### 12. Public Forum

- Cordell future agenda invite someone from Finance re: how the budget process works. Another idea is to invite the arts and cultural manager to speak about public art. I have their emails.
- Phil the Bay Area Explorers Guild made a tiny replica of explorers' guide for the point fairy houses. I will donate to the history association. They are now on google maps. The guide is from Jimmy Robinson.
- Mary Lee said that Jimmy Robinson is a shy guy but it would be great if he could come to talk about this project. Little Point Richmond is on line. Peter spoke to him and asked him to come, but he did not want to come to PRNC.

Peter thanked Dave Bleckinger and Charmain Tyler for everything they have done in their roles. I am looking forward to seeing what Phil and Leisa will bring.
