Since it was established in 1956, the Neighborhood Council system has given the citizens of Richmond a voice with which to communicate with the city council and staff. It's an uncommon

system of two-way communication and although it's not always perfect, it does help get things done. With so many new residents to our neighborhood and some dramatic political and financial questions facing Richmond, it's important to understand what the PRNC can do for you and how your participation matters.

You choose the issues that matter to you.

The board doesn't vote on which issues are discussed at meetings — YOU do! Whether it's to advise the city on local issues, support a project like safety or traffic calming, or discuss voting districts, the PRNC decides which issues are important to our community, then communicates the general membership's opinions to the appropriate city officials. We set the agenda by considering requests, scheduling Land Use Design Review Committee projects, and often feature important guests from city staff or the community. This month, for example, we have a timely presentation from the Fire Marshal. On the lighter side, we have Community Briefs from clubs, organizations, and condominium homeowner associations. Questions can be answered — often on the spot — by your neighbors.

We hope to see you at our next meeting!

So get involved and join the discussion! Ask and answer questions and let your voice be heard by the city. It's easier (and safer) than ever right now, with meetings held via Zoom that you can attend from a computer or cell phone. During the meetings you can cook dinner, tuck the kids into bed, wear your pajamas, or "come as you are." Tell your neighbors and we'll see you on June 29th at 7:30 pm.



1. Call to order and approval of minutes from April 27, 2022

Meeting began at 7:32 p.m. Motion to approve minutes.

Vote: In favor: All, Opposed: None

2. Police Report: No officer in attendance.

3. President's Report, Philip Rosenthal: Phil introduced himself and is thrilled to take over from Peter Thelin who volunteered to take over the Secretary position. The PRNC will be taking off the month of August – there will be no general meeting. Trash and Dumpster Day was a huge success thanks to the help of Philip, Peter and Sue, Eddie Sellers, and Andrew Cohn. As we prepare for next year's event, there have been requests from the community that we try for after Memorial Day due to yard sales. Philip supplied pastries from Roma Cafe. Philip spoke about the request by the Up and Under restaurant for a street closure of Railroad Avenue on July 16th, from 12 o'clock noon to 4 o'clock for a street party. Without signoff from all of the affected neighbors it was decided to decline the request at the present time.

4. Treasurer's Report, Margi Sullivan

We are in great shape financially. I will be picking up the check tomorrow for the \$2500 from the Gateway Foundation. Along with the Mechanics bank, and the new memberships, that brings the total to around \$22,100. Peter reminded us that we will get money from the cannabis company by this time next year.

- 6. **Leisa Johnson** spoke about next month's visit from Fire Marshal Gowen (Chief Montoya has prior commitment and is unable to attend) on June 29. He will speak about annual fire safety review re: vegetation in Richmond area and to review fire department's current schedule, abating city-owned properties in high fire hazard severity zones. (The Point has two of the six zones listed). Prepare questions and concerns to present to the fire marshal. For instance, how does the Richmond fire department and East Bay Regional parks fire department work together? And about the overlap with BNSF property to ensure that all the areas are covered?

It was quite successful and we learned a lot. They are trying to set up emergency training drills for twice a year. May 31st a new display will be installed in the Post Office windows, celebrating Point Richmond's own David Moore; 50 years of Art.

The LUDRC voted to accept this project as planned, with no conditions. A vote was taken to accept the Land Use Design Review Committee's recommendations and approve this project. All in favor. None opposed.
