Stencils will be applied to discourage bikes in Gateway Plaza (the Mechanics Bank Corner).

Plans are also underway for the Spring Fling, which will be held in conjunction with the Arts of Point Richmond's Art Stroll. There will be a full day of events for kids and adults. More details to follow.

Lastly, a shout out to our new councilmember Cesar Zepeda. Cesar has been "boots on the ground" in The Point, learning more about the neighborhood and liaising with city staff to address issues. He is actively involved with getting answers regarding the sewage treatment plant and the sewer main relocation/repair along Keller Beach.
