This month's speaker will be **Dr. Kerby Lynch and staff**, who are working with Chevron to facilitate a Community Action Plan regarding flaring and refinery operations. Funding is on its way for airquality improvements, and Dr. Lynch will introduce us to the process.

In August, there was a special meeting of the LUDRC to address the **Keller Beach sewer project**. This issue is of pressing importance and involves "starting from scratch" with a new set of contractors. The city is short on answers but has hired a consulting firm to liaise between taxpayers and The City. It will be a long process, but there are tens or hundreds of millions of dollars of work to be done, and we want to be sure homeowners are not held responsible for infrastructure.

The "Coffee With a Cop" and Neighborhood Watch meeting was a success, with neighbors meeting neighbors and meeting law enforcement. Thanks to Roma Café and Extreme Pizza for donating

food and beverage.




